Different Habitats

K1 started the week by identifying different habitats and classifying animals, plants etc. depending on where they live and grow. The children were presented with riddles to identify flashcards before sorting them.

Later the children imagined travelling to the different habitats and named things they might see in a glacier, in the ocean, in a forest, or in the desert. They drew the things they came up with, which have been displayed in their classroom.





Oil Spill - Preserving Water

After cleaning the water and removing all the plastic and such, the children discovered that there was an oil spill as two ships had collided and crashed. They gathered near the oil spill all worried and came up with different solutions like using the strainer (net) again. We tested the solution, after which we tried using paper and tissue paper, but nothing worked really well. After a lot of thinking and discussing we tried using the sand together and the sand soaked up the oil.

Children were really happy as sand is a part of water and they would not be polluting it even further if they use the same. The children participated actively and collaborated together to come up with a solution to the problem.





Children's Rights

Using elements of drama, the K1 students learned about the rights of a child. We named the different members of the Bird family - baby brother became George Bird, big sister became Peppa Bird, and mother was simply Mum Bird.

The children took turns playing George and Peppa while the rest of the class watched. Ms. Veera played Mum Bird and narrated storylines to highlight every child's right to nutrition, expression, and schooling.

They were able to verbally describe different types of smells and fragrances around them and also differentiate between a good smell and an unpleasant odour. They were eager to explore the items on display, and some of the children associated the scents with their experiences from their daily life.

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




Imagination

We discussed that we all have a superpower called 'imagination.' It is a great tool for creating something. Sometimes, an old toy might seem boring but with imagination, it can be used in new fun ways. Children were asked to share their ideas, what they could imagine if they are bored of using the same toy again and again.

Children were told that they will make their own toys for playing or create something using their imagination. In small groups they collected materials from their classroom and converted them into toys or created something. It was amazing to see our children create a houseboat, binoculars, water pipe etc.



Creating Blooming Meadows

Our young explorers were divided into groups for making flower music. They chose an instrument for each flower and we associated a flower with this instrument. In the notation the flowers bloom one by one. Each time the teacher showed the flower, the children holding the associated instrument started playing. They had fun following the pattern and creating a musical note accordingly.






Dreamin' Our Islands Away






At the Doctor - A French Role Play
