## Tale with a Twist

In the creative writing session, the students of Grade 5 penned a tale with a twist. The task was to choose their favourite fairy tale and modernise the story. After choosing a fairy tale, the students created a list of characters, setting, and plot. They created a Venn diagram, starting with a list of objects or things that are from the past, to help them come up with specific ideas for making their tale more modern. Through this activity, the students could identify the key elements of a fairy-tale and could recreate a fairy tale in modern times. They also learnt how this time period is different from modern times and how the story becomes different when it's written today.

## Curd Making

With our ongoing topic - microbes - the students of grade 7 had a chance to observe and undertake an experiment to find out the optimum temperature for lactobacillus, a bacteria used to make curd, to work. Curd is produced through the bacterial process of milk fermentation when the bacteria lactobacillus feeds on the sugar in the milk and produces lactic acid. Numerous probiotic micro organisms convert lactose throughout milk into lactic acid during this process. We were in 6 groups and were assigned different temperatures to boil our milk. The 1st temperature was room temperature then $35 \mathrm{c}, 45 \mathrm{c}, 55 \mathrm{c}, 65 \mathrm{c}$ and lastly 75 c . After heating the milk to the designated temperature and adding curd, we waited for almost 5 hours, and then concluded with our results. We also made a graph and wrote a whole paragraph on our mistakes, conclusions and improvements.

## All About Negotiations

Hence, for our PSHCE (Personal, Social, Health, Citizenship Education) lesson, the students of grade 9 were familiarised with the same. During PSHCE classes in particular, there is a strong emphasis on interaction through discussions and activities. To put our knowledge to test, we were divided into groups. We were given a particular prompt and were assigned roles. The idea was for us to act out the improvised discussion in front of the class, and see how we can come to mutual consensus. Overall, the lesson proved to be extremely fruitful as we were able to gain a better comprehension about 'negotiations' and all the tricks behind it.

In the third activity, everyone stood in a row of hula hoops lined at the starting point, the last person in the line passed their hula hoop along the chain to the first person, who then placed the hoop at a distance and moved forward by jumping in it, followed by the other participants behind. The team that crossed the finish line first, while following proper rules, won. Overall, these enjoyable activities strengthened our ability to work together and cooperate as we communicated and devised winning strategies.
