Exploring the Soil

On Tuesday we explored sand, rocks and mud. The children were asked to touch, smell and look at all three closely. After a brief discussion children came to the conclusion that the tub with mud will grow the best plants. They were also explained how soil also needs nutrients like we need. The way we eat food, even plants, requires food.

It was a sensory experience for children, they were also asked to see with their eyes what differences were visible. They made observations about the different textures that they felt in each tub. Children enjoyed exploring the mud and wanted to go on and on.

We later on planted seeds in all three things - sand, rock and soil. The children will now observe the three pots the entire week.







Mandala with Leaves

Children were introduced to mandalas on Wednesday. They were told that they simply mean 'circle'. They are geometric designs that come in different patterns and designs. The kids were shown pictures of different mandalas and that's when they said 'We know this!' Later the class of K1 explored the different leaves they had brought to the classroom. They also sorted the leaves according to size, colour and shape.

Children were then divided into groups to make their very own mandala designs using the leaves. They enjoyed working in groups with their classmates. They later extended their concept of making mandalas by using merry links, jenga blocks etc.

Human body

Learning about body parts is quite overwhelming for students. Grade 2 learnt about the important internal organs and its functions. The class did an activity that involved art along with Biology where they made cartoon cut-outs of the internal organs and identified the factors that are not good for that part. This activity enhanced their critical thinking skills that helped them come up with reasons that affect the organ.

Volcano Activity

Students from Grade 3 and 4 were in awe as they witnessed how a volcano erupts. Together the classes observed how a chemical reaction between an acid (vinegar) and a base (baking soda) can help to erupt a volcano. Hopscotch Tenses

During the English lesson in grade 4, the students were engaged in a fun activity while revising the Grammar topic- Tenses. Through this activity the students could distinguish between verb tenses and choose the correct form of the verbs.

They understood that verbs change form depending on their relationship to time and were able to recognize the past, present, and future tenses of regular and irregular verbs. The students were also encouraged to carry out independent tasks and promote self-learning, testing and evaluation.

Express Yourself - Human & Animal Emotions

For the ongoing unit in IPC-Express Yourself, the students of grade 5 learnt about how animals too have emotions which are often associated only with humans. The students had to research about animals, birds and reptiles having different emotions and the trigger to such emotions.

After completing their research, they understood that animals can feel and demonstrate loyalty, friendship and compassion. Few students who have pets at home shared anecdotes about how they have observed empathy in their pets, as well as grief, fear and other complex emotions. They learnt that there are definite behavioural and physiological similarities in emotional expressions between humans and animals.

Symbolism in the French Revolution

To learn about the significance of symbolism in the French Revolution, the students of Grade 8 created symbols like the liberty cap, the guillotine, the tricolor flag and the cockade.

The students learnt that every symbol depicted some basic values and were used during the French Revolution to ensure public identification and support. They understood that the majority of men and women in the eighteenth century could not read or write, so symbols were frequently used instead of printed words to communicate important thoughts and ideas and also to show their support for the revolution. They also made connections with symbols used in India during the pre-independence era.

Understanding Diffraction

In our physics class, we conducted an experiment to observe the phenomenon called diffraction in water. Diffraction, to put it simply, is the bending of waves around the corners of an obstacle. To do this, we used a ripple tank, which is basically a transparent shallow tub and filled it with water. We shined a light on top of the tub so the motion of the water can be seen more clearly below the tank. Then we placed small obstacles in the way of the waves to observe the effect. When a ripple, or a disturbance, was made in the water; the waves were seen to pass around the obstacle to make their way into the region ahead.

We repeated this experiment with various different types of obstacles and observed the same bending around the object to get past it. Below the tub, we could clearly see that the water was . bending around the obstacle, clearly following the diffraction phenomenon.
